Eat a segment of satsuma and ask your child what it tastes like. Use this as a starting point for investigating what taste buds are and how they work.

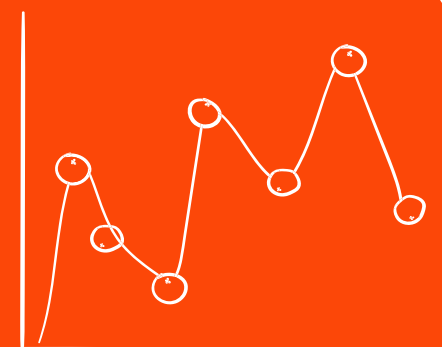
